***Fotos de Familia: Recuerdos de Ciudad Vieja y San Miguel Escobar* (2023)**

Community project registering family photographs, heirlooms, and other affective objects and interviewing residents about their memories of the town prior to 1980, in Ciudad Vieja and San Miguel Escobar, Sacatepéquez, Guatemala, culminating in a local photography exhibition. Coordinated with Carlos Cruz-Gómez and José Castellanos, both from Ciudad Vieja and graduates of the Universidad de San Carlos de Guatemala. The first step of a multi-year project in advance of the 500th anniversary in 2027 of the founding of the Spanish capital city Santiago en Almolonga.

Dynamic, bilingual English-Spanish digital archive that consolidates and makes accessible historical Nahuatl documents from Central America from a variety of repositories, to promote interdisciplinary research on the historical use and evolution of this important imperial language. The project also facilitates sharing of new citations to grow the corpus of available documents. Remembering Madre Rosa: Marquette Maryknolls in Jacaltenango, 1962-1992 (2017-23)

Multi-year research project for undergraduate and graduate student heritage speakers of Spanish on the shared history between Marquette University and the Maryknoll regional hospital in Jacaltenango, Huehuetenango, Guatemala, during that country's counterinsurgency war. Students conducted archival research at the Maryknoll Convent in Ossining, NY, and oral history interviews on three occasions in Guatemala. They published [an article for The Marquette Journal](#), created a bilingual exhibition at Marquette that was also gifted to interviewees and the hospital in Jacaltenango, and hosted a [conversation with Dr. Susan Fitzpatrick Behrens](#). More recently, the History Department's methodology class for majors created an exhibit on gender, Marquette's Medical School, and Catholic missionary activism in Guatemala.

What Was Achieved? Migration, Impunity, and Social Justice After the Peace Accords in El Salvador and Guatemala. <<https://whatwasachieved.wordpress.com/>> (2016)

A two-day conference in Milwaukee, Oct. 27-28, 2016, comparing the results of peace accords in El Salvador and Guatemala two decades later. Roundtable conversations included student, faculty, local, and international perspectives from people with direct experience in the region. Guest speakers included Victor Montejo, Aura Lolita Chávez Ixcaquic, Marcie Mersky, Joaquín Chávez, and Gene Palumbo.
